21/96 Minutes

Matters Arising

- 19/06 Play Park Equipment: Work is due to commence on 19th April [ONGOING]
- 19/29 Memorial Bench: SJ has been given details of the bench supplier to deal direct [ONGOING]
- 19/46 Recycle Bins: In hand with PCC [ONGOING]
- 20/112 Dog Fouling: Signs have been erected and appear to have had a positive effect. P HJ S AA BM to obtain 5 further signs for Midland Lane and Clovers Lane. [ONGOING]
- 20/29 Storyboard: In hand with HJ. [ONGOING]
- 21/04 Football Clubhouse: PW has produced a draft lease, which updates the previous lease. PW will bring to a solicitor to formally draw up for signature. [ONGOING]
- 21/14 Derelict Cottage: PCC have spoken to the owner who has promised to secure the building. [CLOSE]
- 21/37 Village Flag: HJ has had prototypes produced by a graphic designer. All agreed that the stag should have antlers. For the smaller inset flags, P BM S HJ that both flags should be Welsh, P GH, S AA that they should be a Welsh flag and Union Jack. A vote took place and the second proposal with different flags was carried 5 votes to 3. [ONGOING]
- 21/42 Queens Platinum Jubilee Draft arrangements and schedule were discussed and next planning meeting to be at the Hall on 25th April. [ONGOING]
- 21/49 New Legislation: PW distributed a list of available training modules and suggested that each member should take at least one. Some concerns raised about where this over regulation of volunteers may be headed. All agreed that any costs for training courses should be reimbursed from Council funds. [ONGOING]
- 21/72 Road Safety Issues: A discussion took place as to how to proceed with parking restrictions at the top of St Davids Road. [ONGOING]
- 21/77 Toilets: Dave Astins has not yet received an answer regarding ownership of the toilets at the Square. [ONGOING]
- 21/88 Community Garden: All in favour for RD to hire a chipper for use at The Commons on Saturday 23rd when any assistance would be gratefully received.
 Suggestions that large pot could be considered for the Square. A discussion also took place as to how best to publicise for volunteers to assist with the projects. [ONGOING]

- 21/89 Election: SJ gave out nomination forms for Councillors wishing to stand on May 5th. JW announced that she would be moving to Ceredigion, so would not be able to stand and thanked everyone for their support and friendship over the years. She wished her successor well. RD thanked [ONGOING]
- 21/97 Food Box: PW noted that the venture was being run particularly well by Jo and food left there seems to be quickly taken. With the summer coming, some plastic doors could come in useful to give some protection and shade. BM will make enquiries with a supplier to see what could be purchased.
