#### 22/01 Minutes

The minutes of the previous meeting - 18<sup>th</sup> April 2022 were read and accepted as a true record **P** BM **S** GH

## **Matters Arising**

- 19/06 Play Park Equipment: Works due to be completed by end of the week. HJ can we arrange to meet up for a photo when it has been commissioned? [ONGOING]
- 19/29 Memorial Bench: SJ to get price from bench manufacturer [ONGOING]
- 19/46 Recycle Bins: In hand with PCC [ONGOING]
- 20/35 Broadband: AA stated that Voneus have pencilled in Letterston on their build list, along with Welsh Hook, Sealyham, and Little Newcastle. They are holding a promotional event at the Memorial Hall 1pm 8pm on 7th June. PW & AA are hand delivering flyers. [ONGOING]
- 20/112 Dog Fouling: Extra signs on order. Correspondence produced by HJ pointing out that they should be bilingual. After a discussion, P BH, S AA that additional Welsh signs should be produced to go on same posts as existing signs and in future to ensure all signs are bilingual. [ONGOING]
- 20/29 Storyboard: In hand with HJ. [ONGOING]
- 21/04 Football Clubhouse: PW is hoping to bring the proposed lease to JCP solicitors on 20th May, as Eaton, Evans & Morris were involved in the previous lease. [ONGOING]
- 21/37 Village Flag: HJ passed around a modified design which was unanimously approved. P AA, S PW that a copy of the flag be framed and a £25 book token be presented to the winning designer at the Jubilee celebrations. All were in favour. [ONGOING]
- 21/42 Queens Platinum Jubilee PW asked anyone able to attend the penultimate meeting next Monday, 23rd May. Zoom can be arranged. PW thanked Bryn and AA for assistance in distributing 625 leaflets to all properties. Calls and bookings had already been made. Bollards to be placed across gate but a volunteer is required to ensure that essential and disabled vehicles can get in/out. Minibusses currently finish at 6pm, proprietor to be asked if one can be extended. PW has had a quote for £230.97 from St Johns for an ambulance and 2 staff. P RD, S AS to accept. Hall will purchase 300 plastic glasses & charge a deposit to prevent littering [ONGOING]
- 21/49 New Legislation: PW has discussed the structure of a Training Schedule with One Voice Wales and distributed available modules, all of which are done on Zoom. All

encouraged to let PW know before the next meeting. SJ to also take relevant clerk's module. [ONGOING]

- 21/72 Road Safety Issues: AA outlined a conversation with a disabled gentleman complaining of protruding hedges between Clovers Lane and Horeb Chapel. AA will assess. A discussion took place about parking restrictions at the top of St Davids Road. SJ to produce a questionnaire for residents and interested parties. [ONGOING]
- 21/77 Toilets: Reply from PCC shared with the meeting indicating that PCC owned the toilet and LCC the bus stop. This was disputed by members who wished to take the matter further. To move progress in the meantime P GT, S GH that SJ contact PCC to pursue agreement whilst AA makes enquiries with Land Registry and PW does with the Archives. [ONGOING]
- 21/88 Community Garden: RD was thanked for deploying the chipper. RD asked that letters of thanks go to Eamon McGannon and John Bowen for their assistance on the day. RD waiting for the availability of the machine to complete the job. BM will make enquiries about topsoil. Volunteers will be needed for any works at the Square. A request will be made via minutes, website and GT to announce at the Jubilee day. [ONGOING]
- 21/89 Election: SJ gave out declaration of Acceptance forms for Councillors to sign. A charge of £225 from PCC was likely to be received for the uncontested election [ONGOING]
- 21/97 Food Box: BM has spoken to Jo and they agree that a roller shutter is the only option due to wind. BM has been making enquiries with suppliers and SJ will make enquiries with PCC schools catering.
