120/23 Planning Matters

(a) Planning Application Consultation 22/0720/PA

Proposal: Retrospective application for changes to layout/buildings and number/range of holiday units and to agree conditions in retrospect of landscaping and buffer zone. **Site Address:** Norchard Farm House, REDBERTH, Tenby, Pembrokeshire, SA70 8RX

Members discussed the retrospective planning in detail and expressed the following concerns:

Highway – Road Safety. TAN 15 states that surface water should be disposed of to some form of sustainable drainage system. The sites in question are split and accessed by a narrow unclassified road (U6374). In the past, the Community Council has received and forwarded to PCC, reports of surface water pouring onto the highway from the north field site, carrying detritus which in turn blocks drains and makes the road hazardous, especially during freezing conditions. Planning applications 17/0716/PA and 12/0648/PA had conditions imposed as to the surfacing of the access roads, (before the development was brought into use) – this was also reiterated in the Appeal Planning Inspector's Report - to date the applicant still has not undertaken this work.

The Council is also concerned that, what appears to be an aeroplane wing, has been erected near the highway and question whether this should have been subject to planning approval.

• The Community Council are of the opinion that although some of the works commenced prior to the introduction of sustainable drainage legislation on the 7/01/2019, there has been construction of structures (Submarine and Boat) during 2021/2022 and they therefore should be subject to Pembrokeshire County Council SAB Approval.

Environmental Concerns

Bats and Owl Colonies

The Council is very concerned about the impact on wildlife in the area, specifically the disturbance with disco lights, loud music and noise, to the bat and owl population as the north field is believed to be in the bat flight area.

• Pollution Incident / Flood Risk

The Council is aware of a discharge of raw sewage into a stream which was reported to Natural Resources Wales. There are also reports of the stream flooding which could be as a result of insufficient drainage.

• Noise Pollution

The 'Disco Chapel' as advertised is not appropriate. The Council believes there should be no entertainment on site at all, particularly the noise from fireworks, loud music, and late night traffic.

The Council objects to the retrospective planning application and recommends refusal. The retrospective application does not resemble the original plans at all, it is a case of over development and is not in keeping with a quiet rural community.

Resolved that the Clerk, in consultation with Council Members, prepare a report in response to the retrospective planning application consultation and send it to PCC Planning by the extended deadline of the 12^{th of} January 2023
