2023/10 52 Planning Application(s) Received

23/0561/PA St Teilo Penally, Tenby SA70 7PX Removal of existing rear two storey and single storey extensions. Proposed single storey side and rear extensions with single storey front porch, refurbishment and alterations. Following consideration of the information presented, Cllr Neal proposed Penally Community Council support the application, Cllr Walsh seconded the proposal all Cllrs in agreement.

NP/23/0486/TPO Lydstep Beach Holiday Village, Lydstep Haven, Tenby, Pembrokeshire, SA70 7SB. G1 2x elm- Cut both trees to ground level and allow the stumps to regrow (coppice).

G2 various- Cut 2x trees to ground level and allow stumps to regrow (coppice). Remove the lower branches of remaining trees that overhang the compound's fencing to achieve 4 m clearance above the fencing and gas tanks.

G3 sycamore- Coppice the young sycamore directly behind lodge 502 and reduce the height and spread of two trees growing on either side of the young sycamore (heights reduced from 16 m to 10 m, easterly crown spread reduced from 7.5 m to 4 m).

T4 sycamore- Remove the tree, treat the stump to prevent regrowth and plant a replacement tree elsewhere on site. Following consideration of the information presented, Cllr Walsh proposed Penally Community Council support the application, Cllr Rilstone seconded the proposal all Cllrs in agreement.

NP/23/0497/FUL Lydstep Beach Holiday Village, Lydstep Haven, Tenby, Pembrokeshire, SA70 7SB. Installation of solar photovoltaic panels. Following consideration of the information presented, Cllr Rilstone proposed Penally Community Council support the application, Cllr Parkinson seconded the proposal all Cllrs in agreement.

2023/10 55 County Councillor Philip Kidney report

Cllr Kidney reported.

The recent announcement that the Bus service through the village is to become less frequent from every 60 minutes to 90 minutes, has not been well received by residents, PCC will monitor the service. Cllr Rilstone enquired that as the bus services are being reduced could the current bus pass for over 60's be extended to be used on local trains as well, like in other areas of Wales. Cllr Kidney will report back on the suggestion.

Cllr Kidney and Cllr Snow met recently to view the current speeding issues within the village and discussed possible options.

PCC currently carrying out consultation with the Public regarding the locations and suitability of Polling Stations.

PCC have engaged with Enforcement company who will look to deter dog fouling, litter, dropping of cigarettes, and illegal parking within the County.

A seminar to take place shortly, discussing the Brynhir Development, report at the next meeting.

Information for parents of year 6 pupils, the deadline for registering for Senior School for the September 2024 term is the end of December 2023.

PCC reported an increase in homelessness in the County.

2023/10 56 To receive any reports from working parties, including projects.

Cllr Neal reported that clearance of the plot alongside the Church had commenced, quotation awaited from contractors to level the ground and clear larger debris. Project proposal to be added to November meeting.

2023/10 57 To receive reports from Council Representatives

Cllr Boyle proposed Cllr Neal represent Penally CC at the village Hall committee meetings, Cllr Walsh seconded the proposal, all Cllrs in agreement.

Cllr Neal requested seasonal event proposal be added to November agenda.

Cllr Walsh reported there was an increase in large lorries driving through village and having to reverse back to junction because of limited access, signage advising lorries of the narrow roadway will be raised by Cllr Kidney with PCC.
