# St Florence Community Council Ordinary Meeting held at the Village Hall, St Florence

Tuesday 7th November 2017 at 7.30pm

Attendees: Councillors S Hughes (Chair), D Evans, R Hughes, Cllr P Kidney, Jeff Evans, R Ruff (Clerk)

Public Participation (limited to 15 minutes) Mr Stuart Roberts and Mrs Linda Allerton attending the meeting to discuss their concerns about the trees on the common land at the Ford. Both members of the public are feeling distressed about the trees, they shared concerns about falling branches in the past that have fallen close to their properties and the fact that they feel the remaining tress are unsafe. Mr Roberts paid last year at his own expense to have some branches felled and lopped. There seems to be some confusion, after he consulted with PCC as to who's responsibility the tree care belongs to. County Clir Kidney agreed to meet Mr Roberts and Mrs Allerton on Thursday (9/11) down at the Ford to look at the trees and then take advice from Pembrokeshire County Council as to the way forward.

A resident from Ridgeway View attending to listen to feedback from Cllr Kidney, after a meeting at Ridgeway View, with regards to the state of the road, parking and pavements leading into Ridgeway View. Cllr Kidney shared that the main problem is the road remains unadopted and the houses on Ridgeway View are a mixture of council and privately-owned homes, so PCC will only take action on the Council properties, the other residents would have to 'chip in' themselves to get the whole road sorted with drop pavements. Cllr Kidney has emailed Mr Mark Owen at PCC he is in charge of 'street care' for the area, to see if he can help. Otherwise the matter will be taken up with our local MP Mrs Angela Burns. The matter has Health & Safety implications, currently, emergency vehicles cannot gain access down the road because of the parked cars.

New Council Member – Mr Hugh Morgan has very kindly volunteered and was co-opted as a new council member.
