Pembrokeshire County Council Leader, Councillor David Simpson, has provided a further coronavirus update for Thursday, 30th April, as follows:

'Collectively parents and teachers deserve a round of applause. They are ensuring our children's education is not jeopardised by the current situation. The youngsters of today will look back at this in years to come and thank you all for what you are all doing.

'Thank you for looking after our children.

'So tomorrow we start another month so please continue to believe that this storm will soon be over.
