Pembrokeshire currently has ten Town Councils, which serve the area's larger settlements, and 67 Community Councils, which serve the more rural areas.

Town and Community Councils serve their community by exercising a range of statutory powers and duties with the aim of improving the quality of life in their locality.

Each council is made up of elected members, or in some cases co-opted members. Community and Town councils are responsible to their local electorates for delivering a wide range of services and for the provision and upkeep of local amenities.

We have developed a Town and Community Council website that brings together information about all our Town and Community Councils. Most Town and Community Councils have listed their more recent agenda and minutes of meetings along with contact details for individual Town or Community Councillors.


MFFTINGS

Parish Council meetings are normally held on the second Tuesday of each month at either Penybont Vestry or Treffgarne Village Hall, except for August and January. A meeting timetable is posted on the website (appendix1).

During the year the Community Council continued to work on behalf of the local community on a variety of issues. The volunteer community Councillors were assisted by several other groups and individuals, notably the former Clerk and Pembrokeshire County Council.

Meetings start at 8pm, members of the public are welcome to attend although if they want to ask for information, they must submit their question at least 7 days prior to the meeting for it to be added to the agenda and for Councillors to have time to look at the information.

MAP OF WOLFSCASTLE PARISH COUNCIL BOUNDARIES




Wolfscastle is situated in the valley of the Western Cleddau at the northern entrance to the Treffgarne Gorge. It is of equal distance with Fishguard to the north and Haverfordwest to the south on the A40. The Community area also includes the hamlets of Welsh Hook, St Dogwell and Treffgarne.

Residents of Wolfscastle and surrounding areas of which there are an estimated 708 residents have a proud community spirit which is clear to see when we come together for events such as our annual festival week, events held by Ysgol Casblaidd, Penybont and Treffgarne Owen chapels and other events coordinated by enthusiastic village groups and committees. The numerous Wales in Bloom awards and our Britain in Bloom award are proudly displayed in our village.


If you have any problems which fall within the Council's remit, please do tell us about them and we will support you if we can.

We have recently purchased new noticeboards for all sites and are waiting delivery from





VILLAGE IMPROVEMENT FUNDING



The Council has continued to fund projects in the area. New noticeboards have been ordered for both Wolfscastle and Treffgarne villages. They will be installed shortly.

This funding is generally used to improve the area and benefit our residents. An example of this might be the community defibrillators which we regularly pay for replacement pads and batteries as they go out of date. Mr Steve Maycock from Wolfscastle kindly checks

the equipment periodically in Wolfscastle.

We also pay for the Water supply to the Wolfscastle Village fountain.

GOVERNANCE AND ACCOUNTABILITY

Wolfscastle Community Council administers its own affairs effectively as evidenced both by internal and external auditing procedures.

Finances are coordinated by the Responsible Finance Officer and counter signed by two Councillors. There is no petty cash.

The Community Councils main funding for the year was from a Precept of £4,750.00.

The Council is authorised to make available a payment to each of their members of £150.00 per year for costs incurred. However, it was agreed by Councillors in May 2021 not to claim any payments for the 2021-2022 period.

Mr. Eric Williams performed our Internal Audit of accounts shortly after the year end and results were reported in the July 2021 meeting.

Council members formally approved the Annual Governance Statement for 2020/21, answering statements 1-8 in the affirmative (statement 9, regarding trust funds administered by the Community Council was completed as not applicable).

The 'Auditor General appointed Monday, 20th September 2021 as the date from which electors could express their rights under the Public Audit (Wales) Act 2004.' The Notice of Audit was displayed in a conspicuous place by 6 August 2021. The annual return was certified by the RFO and approved by the Council, by 30 June 2021.

An external audit requirement was for the Clerk to have a Contract of Employment.

STAFFING

This year we said a fond farewell to our longstanding Clerk.



Rev. Geoffrey Eynon served our community in the role of Community Council Clerk and Responsible Finance Officer for 39 years. A formal presentation was held at the Welfare Committee Christmas Lunch at Wolfscastle Hotel on 2nd February where Rev. Geoffrey Eynon was presented with gifts and thanked by members of the Council, the Welfare Committee, and villagers. Diolch yn fawr iawn i ti Parch. Mrs. Carol Williams took over the role in January 2022 and hopes to continue with the high standard that has been set over the years.
