## 68.18 Other Business

#### a. Litter Pick - general

D.L & G.E have been busy collecting litter from around the community. In particular, the areas they have covered are: Western Power depot area and from the roundabout (A40) to Boot & Shoe Close. 9 bags of rubbish in total, SY had been asked to arrange collection of the bags.

Areas still to be covered are Dingle Lane & centre of the village.

#### b. LDP workshop

- concerns around points scored for our community:- following discussions it was agreed to correspond with the council noting the following:- we have no village shop as suggested in their plan, but we do have a mobile library and a place of worship. There was also discussion about the new school being in our community.

[following the meeting, through email, it was decided that actually the school and place of worship were not in fact within the boundary as marked out on the plan.] Data needs to be accurate.

- clerk was to ask for a digital copy of the power point.
- Colour coding- Red doesn't fit in with current way of thinking

Amber - not sure

Green – does fit but may not still go ahead [reasons for this would be future demographics, indeterminate population, if the age of population changes, demand on housing will be different]

- local builders should be supported and the general consensus is that local builders do not generally have the financial backing or the capacity to build large housing estates therefore is the council better off approving smaller sites to enable local trade rather than bigger sites which will only attract larger company's/projects.

# c. Council workshops

Following discussion, all members present agreed.

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#### d. Dingle close

Work has apparently stopped, possibly due to finances. Builder has been attempting to sell properties that are half finished. Fear/concerns of bankruptcy before paths and roads are completed.

SY- PCC holds a bond which can be called upon to complete roads – amount unknown

AD- concerns over the general safety of the site – suggested to raise the issues with the HSE

Dangerous water supply, scaffolding pipes, wood over holes where the wood is rotting, inadequate pavements.

G.E thanked the council for his gift & tree, which has been planted in the community garden. Very much appreciated.

#### f. Tree in pavement

BG reported there is a tree in St Leonard's Avenue which is damaging the pavement, enquired into where he should report it to.? Advised – highways.
