Relationship with the principal council

The Community Council has no ongoing formal charters with Pembrokeshire County Council (the Principal Authority).

Audit

Audit of 2019/20 accounts. These accounts represent the most recently externally audited accounts, and were given unqualified approval by the Wales Audit Office auditors.

Achievements during the past year

- £1975 distributed in charitable donations to local and national charities from which local residents benefit.
- Construction and commissioning of new playground on the Vine Field.
- Commissioning of the new speed-activated signage on Langford Road.
- Improvements to Glebelands Field, to enhance it as a recreational area for all residents.
 This to include investigations into the feasibility of replacing the existing wooden pavilion with a new building for community use, and pursuing possible grant applications to obtain funding for the project.
- Supporting of events to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, and commissioning of commemorative tree-planting scheme on Glebelands Field and Vine Field.
- Cleaning and maintenance of five bus shelters situated in the community area.
- Grass-cutting and maintenance of all publicly accessible land owned and controlled by the Community Council.
- Obtaining of grant approval for the provision of two new speed-activated signs in Langford Road, to improve highway safety in the vicinity of the school, and installation of this signage.
- Obtaining of grant approval for the provision of a new play area to be situated on the Vine Field, commissioning and installation of this playpark aimed at younger children.

Priorities for the coming year

- Continue the development of the land at Cunnigar Woods for the benefit of local residents, as a woodland walking and recreational area
- Build on the development of the new Vine Field Playpark by the addition of seating and picnic benches.
- Conduct feasibility studies into the provision of a building to replace the existing wooden pavilion at Glebelands Field with a new multi-purpose building, including possible community 'man-shed' provision.
- Investigate the possible provision of a roller-skate rink at The Close Field Playpark.
