STACKPOLE AND CASTLEMARTIN COMMUNITY COUNCIL

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Minutes of the meeting of Stackpole and Castlemartin Community Council held at Castlemartin Community Hall on Monday, January 15th 2024, at 7.30pm.

Update on current issues

- Floventis Ioan Jenkins and Sara Jones gave a public consultation in Castlemartin Community Hall on the 8th January 2024.
- 2. Precept The Budget for 2024 was discussed and it was agreed to keep the precept the same as the previous year £6300.
- **3.** Clerk CILCA Course The clerk is continuing working through the units with the next unit almost ready to submit.
- **4. Stackpole Church Hall** All of the items have been removed from the church hall and are being stored in a storage container with a view to the hall being demolished.
- **5. Councillor Training** Councillor Clare Strudwick will attend Code of conduct training on the 24 th January 2024.
- 6. Jason's corner heating Work has commenced to install solar panels on properties 2 and 3 the village.
- 7. Bosherston Quarry The quarry sign is on order and will be erected in the spring.
- 8. Spring in Road Stackpole Numerous springs have developed in the road bubbling like a fountain. It is thought that the issue has developed since the BT broadband trench was dug.
- **9.** Castlemartin Play Park Councillor Alderman to obtain funding to plant trees. There was no further update at the time of the meeting.
- 10. St Twynnells 20mph Speed Signs The signs have been positioned on the side of the grass verge fifteen foot apart and could easily be knocked by passing tractor or lorry. Councillor Morris asked the clerk to write to Darren Thomas of Pembrokeshire County Council. The matter has been passed to Claire Williams of Pembrokeshire County Council. The councillors asked the clerk to email Claire Williams for an update.
- 11. Cow Shed Hill Road Signage The councillors asked the clerk to contact Darren Thomas of Pembrokeshire County Council and request signage to reflect the bad bends and T Junction at the top of Cow Shed Hill coming from Castlemartin. This signage has now been reinstated. Pembrokeshire County Council has approved reinstating the slow sign printed on the road approaching St. Petrox narrows from Pembroke and will erect a new sign, dangerous bend between Coed Melyn and the top pf Cowshed Hill. At the time of the meeting, there was no further update and this signage has not yet been installed.
- 12. Bangeston Drains The councillors asked the clerk to contact Darren Thomas of Pembrokeshire County Council to look at the drains on the road near Bangeston Farm, as one of the drains is sunken and water all over the road. The clerk has emailed Darren Thomas of Pembrokeshire County Council in relation to the issue.
- 13. National trust Update Mark Underhill will attend the 5th February 2024 Community Council meeting to provide an update on the Trust's activities and plans. The meeting will be St. Twynnells Community Hall at 7.30 pm.

- 14. Online banking The councillors agreed it would be beneficial for the clerk to have access to online banking to make authorised BACS payments. Councillor Morris and Councillor Evans will contact HSBC to arrange.
