

Watch out for spontaneous events!



Pembrokeshire County Council and Dyfed Powys Police are asking farmers and local landowners and Community Councillors and persons in the community to be on the alert for any signs that spontaneous and pre arranged gatherings are being planned in their locality.

Things to note:

1. Report any suspicious activity immediately to the police.
2. People looking at land or testing hedges, fences or gates.
3. Unusual vehicles driving slowly or stopping in isolated areas.
4. Gatherings of people in and around beaches, vacant land or lay-bys
5. Report any damage to facilities such as toilets, bus shelters and fences

Mobile phones, text messaging and social networking sites such as face book has made it easier for organisers to prepare and plan these events.

There is a need for vigilance and landowners are reminded to take simple precautions.

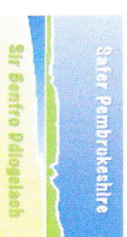
Spontaneous events with gatherings of people can cause considerable anxiety to the community and if they are not dealt with swiftly, they are difficult to stop or otherwise control, - often due to the sheer numbers of people involved and the safety aspects of breaking up such an event.

There is also little doubt that events are well planned, organised and that local knowledge is important in attracting people to a particular vulnerable field or area of land, which has been targeted as a suitable venue.

5. Rhowch wybod am unrhyw ddifrod i gyfleusterau megis toiledau, arosfannau bws a ffensys

Mae ffonau symudol, negeseuon testun a safleoedd rhywydweithio cymdeithasol megis facebook wedi'i wneud yn haws i drefnwyr paratoi a chynllunio'r digwyddiadau hyn.

Mae angen bod ar eich gwyladwriaeth a dylai tirfeddianwyr gofio am gymryd rhagofalon syml.

Gall digwyddiadau digymell gyda phobl yn ymgynnull beri cyn bryder i'r gymuned ac, os na eir i'r afael â hynny'n gyflym, mae'n anodd thoi tefyn arnynt neu eu rheoli fel arall, - yn aml oherwydd y nifer fawr o bobl sy'n gysylltiedig ac agweddau diogelwch ar ddod â digwyddiad o'r fath i ben.

Nid oes fawr o amheuaeth bod digwyddiadau wedi'u cynllunio, eu trefnu'n dda a bod gwybodaeth leol yn bwysig o ran denu pobl at gae neu ardal benodol o dir, sydd wedi'i thargedu fel lleoliad addas.
