MINUTES/CYFNODION

The Minutes of the previous Meeting held on the 3rd February 2016 were proposed and seconded as a correct record by Cllrs. Peter Davies & Vivian Owen, and duly signed by the Chairman.

MATTERS ARISING/MATERION YN CODI

The Clerk confirmed that a letter has been sent to the South Wales Trunk Road Agent, Llandarcy, confirming our commitment to try and make Felindre Farchog safer for residents and others by the installation of flashing speed restriction signs to draw attention to the 40 mph limit for cars and commercial vehicles.

The Clerk also informed the Meeting that Newport Town Council were seriously considering flashing speed signs on their stretch of the A487, and if permission is granted it may be possible to have the same Contractors carry out all the work and purchase of equipment at less cost than commissioning two separate contracts.

Several Councillors reported that the HGV warning signs in Moylegrove still require to be re-sited to a more prominent position to try and ensure drivers do not travel through the village - usually en-route to the Garden Centre.

Our comments regarding placement and height of the National Trust sign at Ceibwr, Moylegrove were duly sent to the P.C.N.P. but several Councillors reported tonight that the sign has already been erected and unfortunately it is neither on the footpath nor has the height been reduced.

The Clerk has been in verbal and written contact with both the National Trust Moylegrove representative and the National Trust Pembrokeshire office in Mathry, because Moylegrove wanted the sign on Patchin Glas and for the sign to clearly request visitors to refrain from leaving any rubbish etc. behind when they depart. The Clerk also told the Mathry office - and confirmed in writing - that we were concerned about the condition of the Ceibwr lime kiln, and asked whether they had plans to carry out restoration work.

The Chairman confirmed that this Council does have a website - www.pembrocsc.co.uk.
A third Councillor is required to sign cheques in the absence of either Cllrs. Peter Marks or Ron Rees. This will be the current Chairman - Cllr. Hedydd Lloyd - who is contacting Lloyds Bank direct.

Mr. Geraint Harries N.P. has felled the trees at the Castle site to enable Chris Caple and his team to carry out further excavation work this summer. The Clerk was requested to write and thank Mr. Harries. Cardigan Town Council's request for the display of posters advertising the Public Meeting on the 15th March to discuss their bid to host the 2020 National Eisteddfod were distributed for Nevern, Moylegrove and Felindre Notice Boards.
