Cllr J Adams reported that he had requested a speed survey in the village.

The reorganisation of Haverfordwest secondary school education had hit a brick wall as the proposed scheme had not found favour with the council. We will most likely lose the 21<sup>st</sup> century funding now.

## 1215 <u>Items for the next Agenda</u> None.

PCSO Jude Parr attended the meeting to explain how we could set up a community speed watch. It is a nationwide incentive which has now been adopted by Dyfed Powys Police. It is volunteer led. They would need ideally 6-10 volunteers on a rotating basis, with 3 needed at any one time – one to use the speed gun, one to take the registration number and one to record the information. It is about having a presence (high vis jackets) not enforcement. All the data will go back to DPP and anyone speeding will receive a letter. On their 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> times they will receive a letter, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> time traffic police will go round and they may receive a Section 59 notice. All this will be recorded and

so if they have any other incidents with the police it will show upon the system. It could lead to them having their licence revoked or the car impounded. If the particular road is found to be an ongoing problem hopefully road safety will take further action and put a speed camera van there.

PCSO Parr will do some posters to put up around the village, it will be in the Round Up newsletter, in the Western Telegraph and also promoted at the village fete on 23<sup>rd</sup> July.
