## TEMPLETON COMMUNITY COUNCIL NEWS

Currently there are six Councillors with three vacant seats. If anyone would like more information or be considered for these vacancies, please contact the Clerk, Vicky Mitchell on 07999 833038. Our primary role is to ensure that our voice is heard by the County Council, reporting issues requiring attention in the village and working to improve facilities in Templeton and district.

Three years ago we applied for Aggregate Levy funding to renew the play park and make it more attractive to a wider age range. As a result we have seen much greater use of the play park with families using the picnic tables and friends finding it a good place to meet in fine weather.

Last year we sold a redundant field and have used the money to purchase the hall from St John's church. This will ensure that the hall will continue to be available in the future for use by villagers. There are already exercise classes, monthly coffee mornings, sewing classes and Templeton Young Farmers.

As part of the planning agreement to build in the field behind the hall we have been given a large area of land as an extension to the village green which we already manage and also land alongside the hall

We are now applying for a grant to enable us to extend the hall creating an additional smaller room and improve the kitchen and toilet facilities. We are hoping to attract organisations to deliver more services to the village such as health, exercise and training courses.

We are currently landscaping an area in the centre of Cold Blow and will be installing a bench.

We work in partnership with the Community Association and jointly fund the annual firework display which can be viewed from the green.
