Minutes of the meeting of Stackpole and Castlemartin Community Council held at Castlemartin Community Hall on Monday, February 11th 2019, at 7.30pm.

Update on current issues

1. Stackpole VC School - sale no news. The school and the majority of the playing field (1.98 acres) is in the ownership of the Council. However this land is subject to a revertor in favour of the Cawdor Estate. Normally a school subject to a revertor would be returned to the original owners (or more usually their descendants) once the closure of the school triggered the revertor. In this case the Council is obliged to offer the school back to the estate at an open market value.

There is a small area of playing field amounting to approximately 0.3 of an acre, which was acquired by way of a later conveyance and this too has to be returned to the Cawdor estate for £1.00.

- 2. St. Twynells Bus Shelter Robert Owens stated after speaking to PCC Property Team that PCC proposes that the shelter is leased to the Community Council so that they can then carry out the required repairs and take on the maintenance of the shelter. I have asked Helen McLeod-Baikie is to contact the community council regarding the lease.
- **3. Councillor Andrew Evans –** has resigned. The only interested party was Gary Evans from the Stackpole Inn. The councillors have invited Gary to join the community council which was proposed by David Edwards and seconded by Steve Alderman.
- **4. Buckspool Farm Pot Hole** The councillors asked the clerk to contact Darren Thomas of PCC in relation to the pot hole that has developed just past Buckspool Farm Yard on the right. The clerk sent in a photograph of the area and Emrys Llewelyn from PCC will arrange for the verge to be built back up.
- 5. Street Lights The councillors asked the clerk to write to Darren Thomas of PCC and report that the street lights at Woodland Rise, St. Twynells, and the bottom of Stackpole Village near the bus shelter and the street light opposite St Govan's Inn in Bosherston and the street light opposite Windsor House in Castlemartin are all not working.
- **6. Fly Tipping** The councillors asked the clerk to contact Pembrokeshire County Council and inform them that some wood has been fly tipped at Forge Hill near Lyserry, Castlemartin.
- 7. Old Post Office Stackpole The councillors asked the clerk to contact Pembrokeshire County Council in relation to the Ivy overgrowing the wall of the Old Post Office in Stackpole which is causing pedestrians to have to walk in the road as the path is

overgrown. The councillors would like to request that the ivy is cut back as soon as is possible.

- **8. Drain Blockage -** The councillors asked the clerk to contact Pembrokeshire County Council in relation to drain blockage in Church Road, Castlemartin, Pembroke, SA71 5HN.
- **9. Internal Audit –** with Ann Williams retirement from the role in 2018 creating a vacancy which be fulfilled for 2018-19 by Debbie James.
- **10.Precept -** The budget was reviewed and a decision was made to reduce the precept to £3000 for the year 2019-20.
