We have received many concerns over the access to orthodontic services for young people who tell us how upsetting this is for them.

Long waiting times (2 years is not unusual); having to travel long distances to reach clinics; pupils having to take a whole day from school; parents/ guardians having to take annual leave for the drive to and from clinic are just a few examples of what families are facing.

# Public Health Wales statement on Novel Coronavirus outbreak in China Updated: Thursday 5 March 2020

Dr Giri Shankar, Incident Director for the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak response at Public Health Wales, said:

Following the announcement by the Chief Medical Officer for Wales of a further Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) case in Wales, Public Health Wales can assure the public that there is no additional risk to the general public.

"The Chief Medical Officer has confirmed that the patient had travelled back to Wales from Northern Italy, where the virus was contracted. Public Health Wales is in the process of identifying and contacting close contacts, and we are taking all appropriate actions to protect the public's health.

"The individual is exhibiting mild symptoms and has been in selfisolation since their return to Wales.

"The patient has been assessed by a specialist infectious disease consultant and is being managed in an appropriate setting, with monitoring on a daily basis.

Coronavirus presents with flu-like symptoms including a fever, a cough, or difficulty breathing. The current evidence is that most cases appear to be mild. Members of the public are advised to help protect themselves and others by always carrying tissues, and using them to catch coughs or sneezes. They should bin the tissue, and to kill the germs, wash their hands with soap and water, or use a sanitiser gel. This is the best way to slow the spread of most, including Coronavirus.

The UK Department for Health and Social Care has issued advice for returning travellers. We would encourage travellers to check the guidance, especially those returning from China, Thailand, Japan, Republic of Korea, Hong Kong, Taiwan, Singapore, Malaysia or Macau in the last 14 days."

## New park and ride service for Glangwili Hospital (PR2)

A new shuttle service started in February will run directly between Nantyci car park and Glangwili Hospital.

The Carmarthen park and ride service PR2 will leave Nantyci car park at 0700, then every half hour until 2130.

The PR1 park and ride service (via Carmarthen town) will continue as normal. Cost for the service is £1 for a day return ticket, with free travel for children under 16 if accompanied by an adult. This service is free for all Hywel Dda UHB employees.
