

## Community Councillor Vacancy Angle NOTICE OF CO-OPTION

The Returning Officer of Pembrokeshire County Council has confirmed that the regulation 10 requests from Electors has not been fulfilled and that Angle Community Council can now fill the casual vacancy by co-option.

## Eligibility and Qualifications to become a Community Councillor

A person is qualified by virtue of being a British or Commonwealth Citizen or Citizen of the Republic of Ireland, who has attained the age of 18 years and is:

- registered as a local government elector for the community of Angle; or who has been
- during the whole of the twelve months preceding the appointment occupied as owner or tenant of the land or other premises in the community; or his/her
- principal or only place of work during those twelve months has been in the community; or has;
- during those twelve months resided in the community or within 4.8 kilometres of it;
- and is not disqualified from holding office by reason of any disqualification set out in section 80 of the Local Government Act 1972, or any decision made under section 79 of the Local Government Act 2000.

Certain people are disqualified from standing, and these include paid officers of the Community Council, anyone subject to bankruptcy restriction orders and those subject to recent sentences of imprisonment.
