
We will continue to wash our hands regularly with soap and hot water and the hand sanitisers provided.

Crocuses and how they are part of Greek mythology

In Classical mythology, Crocus was a mortal youth who, because he was unhappy with his love affair with the nymph Smilax, was turned by the gods into a plant bearing his name, the crocus (saffron). Smilax is believed to have been given a similar fate and transformed into bindweed.

Did you know?

Saffron has often been described as a spice that is worth more than its weight in gold. Saffron comes from the saffron crocus bulb (Crocus sativus), which is an autumn blooming crocus. The spice is actually the red stigmas of this crocus flower. Each flower will only produce three stigmas and each saffron crocus bulb will only produce one flower.
